

Aurora Rising is one of those rare books that grabs you and won't let you go. One part Firefly, one part Mass Effect, two parts fascinating originality - it is a carefully crafted world with backstory and culture. The characters are real people, saints and sinners that you can identify with. I am a sucker for stories with powerful women and this story has them in spades. But these powerful women are real and flawed and even more the heroic for it. There is action and adventure, sci-fi and romance; a little something for everyone. Definitely more than worth the read and I can't wait for the next one to come out!

This book and its predecessor are two of the very best space opera novels I have ever read. I hardly know where to begin. There is a very large cast of characters throughout a wide variety of locations, but it seemed easy to keep them all straight because the story is very compelling. These characters are portrayed in greater or lesser detail, but always fully three-dimensional, because they are depicted foremost from the inside. I want to emphasize how much I enjoyed the character development everywhere in this book. The plot and many, many subplots are each absolutely fascinating. The occasional paragraphs of hard tech or military description are concise and not intrusive. The sex scenes are very well written. There is a good balance of action to introspection. Both books are nice and long. I don't generally like to compare one book with another, but I will say this: I think that this author has certain very great gifts in common with Lois McMaster Bujold. Not a dull moment anywhere. I am impatiently awaiting the next book; I suppose I should warn you of the extreme cliffhanger ending. All in all, enormously entertaining and well worth buying.

Simply put from me if you like space opera, if you like well written characters and development, and if you love a great read - BUY THIS BOOK. And for it to be her first couple novels? Very unusual. You won't be disappointed.

My review of the first book in this series, Starshine, was easy. One word, MAGNIFICENT, said it all

for me. For Vertigo, however, it seems only right to actually say something. Being neither a writer nor a reviewer, I will simply tell of my experience reading Vertigo. The synopsis of Starshine was just enough to refresh my memory. So I dived into Vertigo — assuming nothing could hold me as spellbound as Starshine had. But Vertigo did, so this time I studied a bit to figure out the “why” of each word, each sentence, each paragraph strikes me as “perfect fit”. By that I DON’T mean “as expected”. Aurora Rising is brimming with the UNexpected! I wish I had Ms.

Jennsen’s dexterity with words so I could explain what I mean by perfect fit. Perhaps it is the flow of the narrative. It is not something that catches my attention with any other authors. I find it exhilarating! Speaking of the unexpected: the plot twists and turns are astounding; and yet it all fits----- perfectly!

Absolutely wonderful sequel to Starshine which I ploughed through as fast as my eyes and brain could read it. This is an awesome series - aside from the swearing which I feel is totally unnecessary - and in some ways I felt it got better. Caleb and Alex find themselves on an ‘impossible’ world with dragons no less - now that was a surprise plot twist and I loved it. Caleb gets to play a ‘knight’ and battles a dragon whilst looking for Alex who has been snaffled by one of the aliens. Meanwhile the aliens have begun a full-scale attack on the Federation and Alliance colonies; Richard and his Federation counter-part start getting a handle on the conspiracy that has plunged the two opposing human governments into war. More is learned about the aliens and why they don’t want humanity expanding towards the Metis nebula; Alex learns more about how her father died and the mother whom she has a crappy relationship with; we even find something about Caleb’s missing father that was an interesting surprise. Jennsen has created a thoroughly enjoyable story with some very good, complex characters. Highly recommend this series to fans who love a bit of romance along-side war and political drama.
