

Tana French has been my favorite author of literary mysteries for a very long time. I have now discovered Susie Steiner and both she and Ms. French share a place on my 'favorite list'. Ms. Steiner writes in a way that inhabits her characters, gives them life, and resurrects them from the page. She is able to develop characters while also providing psychological intrigue. Detective Manon Bradshaw is 42 years old, single and very pregnant. She has moved from London to Cambridgeshire to give her 12 year old adopted son, Fly, a better chance at succeeding. While they were in London she feared that Fly was cavorting with a bad crowd and, given his brother's death and his mother's history of addiction, Manon wanted to help him while she had the chance. This move, however, is not what Fly wanted. He is being bullied at a school that is almost lily white and he feels out of step and alone in Cambridgeshire. On top of that, Manon is having another child. What could she want with him he thinks. Manon and Fly live with Manon's sister Ellie and her son Solly. Fly loves Solly and is very good with him. However, it is not long before Fly is arrested as the main suspect in the knifing murder of Ellie's ex who is also Solly's father. Fly is unmoored and lashes out at Manon, feeling like it is her fault that she is in this predicament. On top of that, because of Manon's closeness to the case, she is asked to step aside and not participate in any aspect of the investigation. The word 'no' is not enough to stop Manon and her love for Fly has no bounds. As she navigates the twists and turns of this squirrelly ride, she comes face to face with situations that not only puzzle her but have her questioning herself and her family. What she wants

most is to win back Fly's love and trust but she is smart enough to realize that this takes time, not just determination. She asks herself repeatedly why she got pregnant, why she wanted another child when she already had Fly. The psychological insight into the book's protagonists is excellent. I felt like I knew each and every one of them and what made them tick. There are no red herrings and every single loose end of this wonderful novel is tied up at the end. Steiner's first book 'Missing, Presumed, gives a background for this second novel in the series but is not a necessary prerequisite in order to read and love this second installment. It is rare that a mystery has the profound depths and insight as those shown in 'Persons Unknown'.
