

My one year old LOVES this book. It is definitely his favorite book and he laughs whenever he sees it and goes through the pages over and over pointing at everything. Some reviewers mentioned scary pictures "not fit for children," but my son has never shown the least bit of fear while looking at this book. Who decided all children's books had to be boring, happy cartoons anyway? Perhaps this book's uniqueness is why it appeals so much to children.

This will be a super fun book to "read" to my children!

I bought this as a Christmas gift for my 18 month old as she loves board books and we like Star Trek. The book is larger than I expected, which is nice because then you can really see the pictures. Overall I like it, my only complaint is that the "mean/nice" page seems pretty biased where the "mean" picture is a not terribly attractive creature and "nice" is a pretty woman. I like that the book features some abstract concepts like emotions and temperature that I do not often see featured in other books. We purchased a copy of this book to give to my father so he can read her the book over video-chat and he also likes the book and thinks it funny.

We first discovered this book at a comic convention in Boston and were disappointed it wasn't for sale. We purchased it immediately for our toddler and gave it to her on a road trip to her first convention. She loves the photos and enjoys the opposites, especially "mean and nice" and Mr. Spock's "calm and surprised", and of course the Tribbles "one and many". Highly recommended for you geek parents out there. Adults will love this book just as much.

My mom is into the old star trek and she will be babysitting my nephew when he's born so this was a wonderful gift to give her so she can show it to my nephew when he visits. She thought it was awesome and hopefully my new nephew will start to like star trek too.

Unfortunately, I found the pictures (images from TOS episodes) to often be far more disturbing than I would choose for a small child.
