Yes, Last Stand is darker than the first three books, but it's that darkness that makes the story and characters so much more real. Last Stand is about war and betrayal and secrets, so there's not a lot of room for sunshine and rainbows. Though there are some lighthearted moments, most of the book

put me through an emotional wringer (in the best way possible). This is one of the best series conclusions I've read in a long time and it's a story that will stay with me long after the final page.
