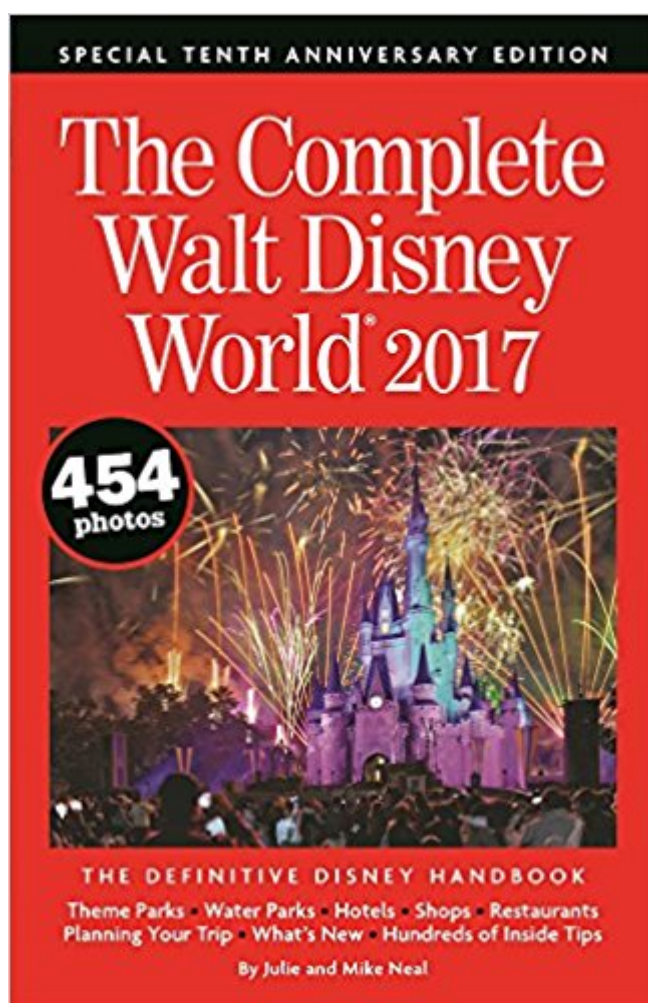




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The Complete Walt Disney World 2017 (Complete Walt Disney World: The Definitive Disney Handbook)

Individual articles focus on the complex stuff -- planning strategies, Disney's My Magic+ system, its Fastpass+ ride reservation system -- all in a clear, concise way that's easy to understand. Other articles offer imaginative ways to involve your children in your planning, and tips for attending Disney's holiday events. Then comes ticket prices and other practical information in a breeze-to-browse mini-chapter, Disney Planning A-Z. Honest Abe wants the redhead. Hundreds of new Fun Facts and Fun Finds include the secret spots Disney has placed

duplicate figures from its Hall of Presidents. And yes, one of them hides in plain sight at the Pirates of the Caribbean, complete with his stovepipe hat. Something else you should know. ã ã The Complete Walt Disney World is the only major Disney guide written by authors who live in Orlando. Julie Neal has spent nearly 2,000 days at Disney over the past ten years; she used to work there as a concierge supervisor. Last year she led CNN correspondent Richard Quest through the Magic Kingdom in an episode of "CNN Business Traveler."

We purchased the guide 5 years ago and loved it, passing it on to friends and family. We will be going back to Disney World and this was the first guide we picked out for our trip. We like the maps and organization for the parks. The personal preferences and photos are a huge help. We liked the highs and lows for each hotel, making it easier to narrow down our choices. Use the phone directory - it works. The organization by park area is a help in putting together your daily trips and making sure you do not miss anything. The big drawback is the index. The pagination does not match the actual pages you are directed to. We ended up marking up the index so we could follow what we wanted to find. The guide should never have been issued with this glaring fault.

It's fun to browse through but when you try to find an actual item, the index is incorrect. I read the review before purchasing and everyone says it's great. The one negative review has this info buried at the bottom. I should have read ALL of it more closely. I will most likely be returning.

ã ã The Complete Walt Disney World 2017 aims to be the authoritative (but unofficial) guide to planning out your Walt Disney World vacation. It is over 400 pages full of bright photos and detailed descriptions of every ride, hotel, restaurant and just about any other attraction you can think of related to Walt Disney World. And while I wouldn't take it as the only source of information for your once-in-a-lifetime trip, sitting down with it for a few hours will certainly make you a well informed patron before your visit. This is a book that you're going to want to get well in advance of your trip - like a year in advance. Its logical layout and color coded pages make it useful as a reference, but it can also be read front-to-back, which is the way I approached it. While you'll probably want to take the book along with you on your trip, I don't think you'll get enough use out of it while you're actually in the park to warrant bringing it along - this sucker is heavy! Each park and each land in each park has an introduction, which will serve total newbies well. Then even each ride (or "attraction") at Disney World is covered with a photo, description, rating, and helpful facts that even most Disney World vets may not be able to tell you like how long each ride lasts or some small detail to look for

in the line queue. This works out to be a great structure- the photo and description helped get my kids pumped for our trip while the ratings and some of the facts helped us plan which rides we really wanted to do. The last 50 pages or so are going to be where the book really pays for itself in filling out your trip logistics. Every Disney hotel is outlined with pros & cons, and prices. Past that, the "Trip Planning" section gives you the low-down on some of the things you might have heard of but might not know what they are or how to make the most of them- like character breakfasts and MyMagic+. You'll want to read these pages to avoid, for instance, showing up at the Bibbidi Bobbidi Boutique without a reservation. Having a guide book that is not officially affiliated with Disney is a real benefit here. The authors are able to give readers an unbiased opinion on the rides, restaurants, and hotels. And while they might be wrong in some cases (see my video to hear all about how wrong they are about Splash Mountain. So wrong...), at least you can be sure their opinion isn't going through a corporate advertising machine. This also means the book isn't necessarily as polished as you would get directly from Disney- and that's okay too. Aside from a few strange selections, the photos are very high quality and the writing mostly feels like it's out of a catalog, though it tends to start to feel more like a blog in the later sections. If you're a newcomer to Disney, this book comes highly recommended. Yes you can find the same information from different sources on the internet for free, but having it laid out in an organized way in one place that you can reference offline is invaluable. My strategy would be to read this and look up second opinions or clarifications online where you have specific questions. Even if you still have to find a forum and ask other Disney experts yourself, after reading this you'll know you're asking the right questions. Ultimately this is a great starting point for your trip and will give you a big head start if you're feeling anxious about your trip planning. Disney park pros will have less use for it, though I did learn a lot from it myself, and it was great in getting my kids pumped up about our next trip. It combines a broad scope with a smart layout to make the information not feel overwhelming, and balances thousand-foot view descriptions with very low level details to provide value to both the novice and professional park goer. Like Chef Mickey's says page 310 but on page 310 it's Disney Springs and Test Track is listed on 134/135 but it's really on page 146 and etc....Is there an updated book with the right page numbers?

It's difficult to look up something specific when the index is completely incorrect. I think the information is fine, but it takes so long to find it, it's not worth the hassle!

I can't say that's a downside to the book; it just means that it appears the author has done extensive research, so it should appeal to an individual who is wanting basic information and can skip over some of the details to someone who wants to know the ins and outs of the rides/locations. I'll still do my own set of research and planning based on Disney's scheduled events that are ever changing. There are a few areas in the book with information labeled as updates, so if you've purchased the book in the last two years, you may not benefit much from purchasing a new edition. I'm sure next year will be a different story with the additions to the parks. I can say that I am pleased that I chose this as my first guidebook for WDW.

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
