

There are a few reasons why this guide, written by someone who doesn't work for the tourist industry, differs from the others you'll come across. Unlike most glossy travel guides on the City, in Wee Glesca you will not find a lengthy history of the City you could find online in a heartbeat if you were really interested; climate details and weather trends. When it boils down to it, you get here, look out the window, dress appropriately. Enough said!; fancy pictures taken by professionals, designed to make the place look fantastic (which it really is), but which just increase the size of the book when all you really need is the right information; travel writer verbal diarrhea, with flowery language most Glaswegians would just find totally ridiculous; maps you can't follow. Future editions may include a map or two, but for the most part you would be better served getting a guide like this and a proper separate map; endless lists of hotels. Let's be honest, you will likely have found online a place to stay before you travel here, so why would you want your guidebook stuffed with hotels just for the sake of it? What you will find is, well, pretty much all you need to squeeze the most out of your visit here. Top ten lists of arts & history attractions, shopping hotspots, music venues, theatres, restaurants, festivals and more; telephone numbers, addresses, opening times & links to websites, Twitter feeds and Facebook pages; bang up to date information. Most guides are fairly out of date, this one isn't!; information from a real insider, a local, a dude who lives here and sees with his own eyes how best to experience Glasgow day in day out; everything nicely drilled down and packaged so you can print off or bookmark what you need. This guide is a must have if you are going to visit Glasgow. It is a travel guide that is actually full of info that will help you get the most out of your trip to Glasgow. It doesn't have loads of useless info like weather, history, or hotels. I mean seriously, there's hardly anyone who is going to take a trip to a major city and not have their hotel planned ahead and purchased online...Instead of wasting your time, the author has broken the guide up into sections of things you might want to do (like arts & history, festivals, restaurants, etc.), then in each section he gives a top ten list of things to do or experience. Each entry is accompanied by a brief description and why he thinks it is a great experience. Some pictures to go with his info would be nice (I like pretty shiny things), but the quality of the content more than makes up for this minor shortcoming. His info is interesting and helpful, and his perspective and knowledge (that of a regular local) is so much better than what you would get from a standard travel industry guide churned out by who knows what writer pushing who knows what agenda. Overall, if you are going to Glasgow and want to know what to do while you're there, this guide is a must have.

Some travel guides can be really dry and boring, because they churn out fact after fact. But, this pocket guide was just the opposite. I found it such an enjoyable, easy read, and it left me feeling really enthusiastic about experiencing the multitude of things to do in the city of Glasgow. I suppose the author achieved this by giving you the lowdown on a particular place/attraction from a very personal point of view, and his love of Glasgow came through, making you keen to visit that particular place yourself. He then follows up with the main facts, such as contact details, opening hours, website etc. I would say the book's ideal for anyone wanting to plan their visit to Glasgow, and also for anyone already living there.
