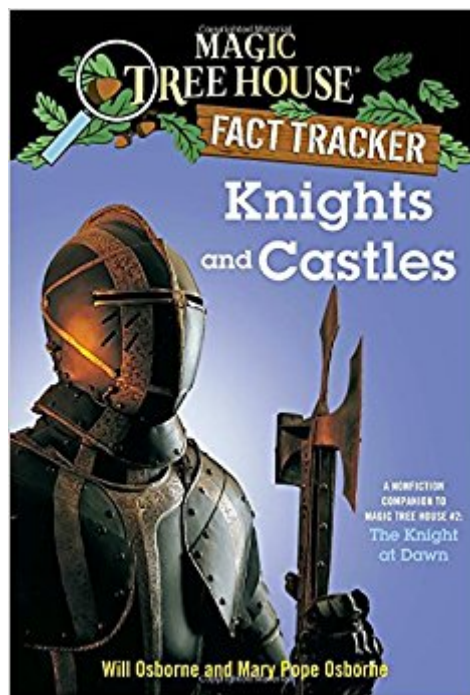

Has complimentary content to the companion fiction/action books. Rounds our historical information to give children a broader understanding of era, but in a fun way. Black and white illustrations/line drawings.

We love all the research guides for MTH. They are written at a higher Lexile level than the stories but it makes them fun to read together. My 6 year old doesn't have the patience to read through a research guide the entire way through on her own but together it makes for a fun project...she gets to tell me about what happened in the story to Jack & Annie and together we learn some fun facts

about whatever time/place the story was about.

My daughter loves the Magic Tree House series and she loves this book as well. However, my complaint with this book has to do with the way it is formatted for Kindle. You can only view this book in the landscape orientation (I tested this on two different devices) as a two-page spread. This makes the pages too small on the 6" sized Kindle and there's no option to just view the book in the vertical orientation, one page at a time. Other Magic Tree House books (in the regular series, not the Fact Checker line) that I've checked out from the library don't have this issue.

I bought a set of four of these books (knights, mummies, pirates, dinosaurs) with the accompanying research guides for my 5-yr old grandson, who is already an outstanding reader. He absolutely loves them and reads them either with his parents or to himself every night. They are his favorite books. The accompanying research guides that go with the stories are a fantastic learning experience which he also loves. I will definitely buy him more in the future of these Magic Tree House books and research guides!
